## PREFACE

This report is issued on a monthly basis and aims at providing a general view of the external trade of Cyprus and its partner countries for October 2009. It is divided into three parts. Part A pertains to total trade statistics under the general trade system, Part B to Extra-EU trade statistics under the special trade system and Part C to Intra-EU trade statistics. All values shown in the tables of this report are in Euros.

The statistics of trade with non-EU countries (Extra-EU trade) are compiled mainly from THESEAS system, the computerised system of Customs Authorities for imports and the Single Administrative Document for exports. The statistics of trade with EU countries (Intra-EU trade) are compiled via the INTRASTAT system and the data collected via the VAT returns.

The valuable cooperation of the Department of Customs and Excise and the VAT Service is acknowledged.

This report was prepared by the staff of the Foreign Trade Section, under the guidance of Mrs Evi Kalogirou, Statistics Office and the general supervision of Mr. George Zeitountsian, Senior Statistics Officer, Head of the National Accounts and Foreign Trade Sections.

## INTRODUCTION

### DEVELOPMENTS IN EXTERNAL TRADE FOR OCTOBER 2009

**Total imports/arrivals** (covering total imports from third countries and arrivals from E.U countries) in October 2009 amounted to €475,6mn as compared to €626,5mn in October 2008. **Total exports/dispatches** (covering total exports to third countries and dispatches to other Member States) in October 2009 were €84,9mn compared to €89,7mn in October 2008. As a result of the above developments the trade deficit was €390,7mn in October 2009 compared to €536,7mn in the corresponding month of 2008.

#### Total imports/arrivals

Imported goods were €475,6mn in October 2009 and €626,5mn in October 2008.

##### a. **Total imports/arrivals by H.S Section**

Section V 'Mineral products' head the list with €89,7mn followed by Section XVI 'Machinery, electrical equipment and parts' with €72,9mn, Section VI 'Products of the chemical or allied industry' with €45,5mn, Section XVII 'Vehicles, aircraft, vessels and associated transport equipment' with €40,3mn and Section IV 'Prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits and vinegar, tobacco and manufactured tobacco substitutes' with €39,2mn.

##### b. **Total imports/arrivals by economic destination**

- Consumer goods valued at €163,3mn or 34,3% in October 2009 and €198,6mn or 31,7% in the respective month of 2008.
- Intermediate inputs valued at €133,5mn or 28,1% as against €181,1mn or 28,9% in October 2008. The manufacturing sector absorbed €67,1mn as compared with €101,7mn in October 2008. Raw materials for the construction sector were €27,1mn in October 2009 and €34,5mn in October 2008.
- Fuels and lubricants, including crude petroleum oil, valued at €88,8mn in October 2009 and €113,0mn in the corresponding month of 2008.
- Capital goods valued at €42,6mn in October 2009 and €52,4mn in October 2008. The manufacturing sector was €9,2mn in October 2009 as against €10,0mn in October 2008. Capital goods for the construction and mining sectors valued at €4,3mn in October 2009 and €7,9mn in October 2008. The transport, storage and communication sector absorbed €5,0mn as against €7,7mn in October 2008. Capital goods for agriculture accounted for €3,5mn in October 2009 and €4,0mn in the corresponding month of 2008.
- Transport equipment with their parts accounted for €46,6mn in October 2009 as compared with €81,2mn in October 2008.

**c. Total imports/arrivals by area**

- The European Union continued to be the main source of supply of goods to Cyprus in October 2009, with a share of €358,4mn of total imports/arrivals. Major suppliers within the Union were Greece with €92,7mn, Italy €50,6mn, Germany €46,8mn and the United Kingdom €40,4mn.
- Imports from all other European countries totaled €16,6mn in October 2009.
- Imports from the rest of the world in October 2009 amounted to €100,6mn with Israel contributing €36,1mn, China (People's Republic of) with €22,5mn, Japan with €6,9mn, Thailand with €2,2mn, Taiwan with €1,6mn and Brazil with €1,3mn

**Total imports/arrivals destined for home use**

Imported goods destined for home use were €455,7mn in October 2009 and €604,9mn in October 2008.

**a. Imports/arrivals destined for home use by economic destination**

- Consumer goods valued at €158,5mn or 34,8% and €191,2mn or 31,6% in October 2009 and in October 2008, accordingly.
- Intermediate inputs valued at €130,7mn or 28,7% as against €178,8mn or 29,6% in October 2008. The manufacturing sector absorbed €66,5mn as compared with €100,7mn in October 2008. Raw materials for the construction sector were €27,4mn in October 2009 and €34,8mn in October 2008.
- Fuels and lubricants, including crude petroleum oil, valued at €78,2mn in October 2009 and €101,9mn in the corresponding month of 2008.
- Capital goods valued at €41,9mn in October 2009 and €51,3mn in October 2008. The manufacturing sector was €9,0mn in October 2009 as against €10,0mn in October 2008. Capital goods for the construction and mining sectors valued at €4,3mn in October 2009 and €7,9mn in October 2008. The transport, storage and communication sector absorbed €4,7mn as against €7,3mn in October 2008. Capital goods for agriculture accounted for €3,5mn in October 2009 and €4,0mn the respective month of 2008.
- Transport equipment with their parts accounted for €45,6mn in October 2009 as compared with €81,5mn in October 2008.

**Total exports/dispatches**

Total exports/dispatches, including stores and provisions, accounted for €84,9mn as compared with €89,7mn in October 2008. Total exports/dispatches of domestically produced goods, including stores and provisions, were €38,3mn in October 2009 whilst total exports/dispatches of foreign goods, including stores and provisions, were €46,6mn.



**a. Total exports/dispatches, including stores and provisions, by H.S Section**

Section V 'Mineral products' head the list with €19,0mn followed by Section VI 'Products of the chemical or allied industries' with €14,4mn, Section XVI 'Machinery, electrical equipment and parts' with €14,3mn and Section IV 'Prepared foodstuffs; beverage, spirits and vinegar, tobacco and manufactured tobacco substitutes' with €8,2mn.

**b. Total exports/dispatches of domestically produced goods, excluding stores and provisions, by category**

- Industrial products of domestic produce exported during October 2009 valued at €35,5mn and €35,5mn in October 2008.
- Exports/dispatches of raw agricultural products valued at €2,2mn or 5,7% in October 2009 and €2,9mn or 7,5% in the corresponding month of 2008.
- Mineral exports valued at €0,6mn or 1,5% in October 2009 and €0,7mn or 1,9% in October 2008.

**c. Total exports/dispatches by area**

- Dispatches to the European Union accounted for €39,2mn in October 2009 of the total exports/dispatches. Dispatches to Greece accounted for €15,1mn, to Germany €10,2mn and to the United Kingdom for €5,6mn.
- Exports to Near and Middle Eastern countries occupied the second place in importance with €11,0mn for the month in reference.
- Exports to all other European countries followed in importance with €1,8mn.
- Exports to the Asian countries in October 2009 amounted with €4,5mn.
- Exports to the rest of the world accounted for October 2009 accounted to €10,5mn.
- Stores and provisions in October 2009 valued at €17,9mn.

## DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED

### Arrivals

"Arrivals" are analogous to imports.

Arrivals include:

- a) goods in free circulation which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus;
- b) goods which have been placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (for processing, transformation or repair) in another Member State and which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus.
- c) Some goods movements are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular, aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in another Member State to a person established in the Cyprus are included in the statistics of arrivals of Cyprus.

### Dispatches

"Dispatches" are analogous to exports.

Dispatches include:

- a) goods in free circulation which leave the statistical territory of Cyprus bound for another Member State;
- b) goods which have been placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (for processing, transformation or repair) in Cyprus and which are destined for another Member State.
- c) Some goods movements are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular, aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in the Cyprus to a person established in another Member State are included in the statistics on dispatches of Cyprus.

### Imports

Imports **under special trade system** include:

a) Goods, which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus from a non-member country and are:

- Placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for release into free circulation (goods intended to be consumed in Cyprus or dispatched to another Member State), either immediately or after a period in a CUSTOMS warehouse or
- Placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (usually goods destined to be processed, transformed or repaired for subsequent re-export) either immediately or after a period in a CUSTOMS warehouse.

b) Some movements of goods are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular, aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in a non-member country to a person established in Cyprus are included in import statistics of Cyprus.

### Exports

Exports **under special trade system** include:

a) goods that leave the statistical territory of Cyprus bound for a non-member country, having gone through:

- The CUSTOMS export procedure (final export, export following inward processing, etc.); or
- The CUSTOMS outward-processing procedure (usually goods destined to be processed, transformed or repaired for subsequent re-import).

**The Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS)**

The Harmonised System is a legal instrument adopted by the Customs Co-operation Council (now the World Customs Organisation) in June 1983 and the International Convention on the Harmonised System (H.S. Convention) entered into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1988.

According to the H.S. Convention, the HS “means the Nomenclature comprising the headings and the subheadings and their related numerical codes, the Section, Chapter and Subheadings notes and the General Rules for the interpretation of the Harmonised System”. The H.S. is designed as a “multipurpose nomenclature”, to be used for transportable goods. Both H.S. and C.N. are therefore concerned heavily with the nature or material of the product.

**The shape of the H.S. and the C.N. classifications is illustrated in the following table:**

**The general structure of HS is as follows:**

Sections I-IV: Agricultural products

Sections V-VII: Minerals, chemicals and related products, plastics, rubber and articles thereof

Sections VIII-X: Animal products, such as hides, skins and furskins, as well as wood, cork, pulp, paper and articles thereof

Sections XI-XII: Textile, footwear and headgear

Sections XIII-XV: Articles of stone, plaster, cement, asbestos, mica and the like, ceramic products, glass, pearls, precious or semi-precious stones, precious metals, jewellery, base metals and articles thereof

Section XVI: Machinery, mechanical appliances and electrical equipment

Section XVII: Vehicles, aircraft, vessels and associated transport equipment

Section XVIII: Optical, photographic, cinematographic, measuring, checking, precision, medical or surgical instruments and apparatus, clocks and watches, musical instruments

Section XIX: Arms and ammunition

Sections XX-XXI: Miscellaneous manufactured articles, such as furniture, lighting fittings, prefabricated buildings, sports requisites, works of art, collectors’ pieces and antiques

**Trade systems**

There are broadly two approaches, closely linked with customs procedures, used for the measurement of international trade in goods: the general trade system and the special trade system.

**General trade system**

The general trade system is the wider concept and under it the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the economic territory of Cyprus with the exception of simple transit trade. In particular all goods which are received into customs warehouses are recorded as imports at that stage whether or not they subsequently go into free circulation in Cyprus. Similarly, outgoing goods from customs warehouses are included in the general trade aggregates at the time they leave Cyprus.

### **Special trade system**

The special trade system is a narrower concept. Goods from a foreign country which are received into customs warehouse are not recorded in the special trade aggregates unless they subsequently go into free circulation in Cyprus (or are placed under the customs procedures for inward processing). Similarly, outgoing goods from customs warehouses are not recorded as exports.

### **Partner country**

For exports and dispatches, the trading partner is the country (or Member State) of final destination of the goods. The last country to which the goods are specifically directed on their outward movement from the State is regarded as their final destination. This is not necessarily the country in which the good will be unshipped or that in which they will be finally consumed.

For imports (extra-EU trade), the trading partner is the country of origin. In general, goods obtained entirely from a given country originate in that country. A product, in the production of which two or more countries were concerned, is considered as originating in the country in which the last transformation or substantial processing took place. Packing repacking, sorting and blending are not regarded as manufacturing processes.

For arrivals (intra-EU trade), the trading partner is the Member State of consignment of the goods.

### **Country classification**

The classification of countries is the country nomenclature (Geonomenclature) as set annually in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

### **Stores and provisions**

Stores and provisions denote ships' and aircraft's stores and supplies.

- ships' and aircraft's stores' means the various products for consumption by the crew and

passengers of vessels or aircraft;

- ships and aircraft's supplies' means the products for the operation of the engines, machines and other equipment on vessels or aircraft, such as fuel, oil and lubricants.

### **Domestic and foreign goods**

Domestic goods are goods originating in the economic territory of Cyprus; if they have been wholly obtained in it or were substantially transformed by processing in it, so that the processing confers domestic origin. Goods originally imported and having undergone only repair or minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged are not defined as domestic. Minor operations include blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, sorting, husking and selling.

Foreign goods are goods originating in the rest of the world, i.e not included in the economic territory of Cyprus and compensating goods obtained under the outward processing procedure when such processing confers foreign origin.
