MONTHLY ECONOMIC INDICATORS

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P R E F A C E

The “Monthly Economic Indicators” is designed to bring together selected economic indicators so as to capture significant short-term developments in the Cyprus economy. This report is produced directly from a computerised information storage system.

As far as possible, monthly data are presented for the last twenty-five months, quarterly data for the last eight quarters, and annual data for the last three years.

This edition refers to the first half of 2004 although in certain cases it also includes recently available data covering the months January-October 2004.

Most of the data are compiled by the Statistical Service. The indicators on the balance of payments, foreign exchange and the monetary sector are provided by the Central Bank of Cyprus and the Department of Co-operative Development. The Government accounts are prepared by the Ministry of Finance. Part of the data on tourism is compiled by the Cyprus Tourism Organisation and the data on share price indices by the Cyprus Stock Exchange.

The co-ordination of the various series and the preparation of this publication was undertaken by the National Accounts Section of the Statistical Service, under the supervision of Mr Zeitountsian, officer-in-charge of the section, assisted by Mrs A. Christodoulou and Mrs M. Constantinou.

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OUTLINE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

The economy continued its expansion through the year 2004, with a growth rate provisionally anticipated to be of the order of 3,5%.

More particularly, the main developments were as follows:

- During the period January-September 2004, arrivals of **travellers** (including excursionists) reached 2.672.169 showing an increase of 7,2%, while arrivals of tourists reached 1.877.260 recording an increase of 2,9% compared to the same period of the previous year.
- **Manufacturing production** during January-August 2004 showed a 0,6% increase compared to 2003. The food, beverages & tobacco industry showed a decrease of 0,2% while the textiles & textile products industry recorded a decline of 8,6%.

Domestic exports of manufactured products fell to £49,3mn and recorded a decrease of 3,2% during January-April 2004. Exports of pharmaceutical products rose to £13,7mn and recorded an increase of 16,8% compared to January-April 2003. Exports of clothing fell to £2,0mn and showed a decline of 38,1%, while exports of cigarettes rose to £3,8mn or increased by 216,5%.

- As regard the **construction** activity, local sales of cement increased by 19,1% during January-September 2004. The area of building permits authorised, which is a leading indicator of the future performance of construction activity, increased by 11,6% during January-August 2004.
- At the end of October 2004, the number of **registered unemployed** rose to 10.163 or 2,9% of the economically active population, compared to 10.134 or 3,0% of the economically active population in October 2003.
- During January-October 2004, **motor vehicle registrations** reached a total number of 45.655, recording an increase of 31,3% compared to the same period of the previous year. Registrations of private saloon cars increased to 35.169 or increased by 47,5% while light goods vehicles fell to 2.963 and recorded a decrease of 9,7%.
- **Consumer demand** during January-July 2004 as indicated by the turnover index of retail trade, showed an increase of 5,5% in nominal terms and an increase of 3,0% in real terms.
- The rate of **inflation** as measured by the consumer price index, showed an average increase of 2,0% during January-October 2004. The prices of local products increased by 4,7% and by 3,1% those of services, while the prices of imported products decreased by 6,1%.

- During January-July 2004, total **imports** rose to £1.593,0mn or increased by 17,1%. Total **exports** rose to £300,3mn or increased by 1,8%.
- The **balance of payments** current account, showed a deficit of £424,3mn during January-June 2004 compared to a deficit of £303,9mn in January-June 2003.
- The **total Money Supply** during January-September 2004, expanded at a higher seasonally adjusted growth rate (on an annual basis) of 9,3%, compared to a 4,0% growth rate in January-September 2003. An acceleration was also observed in the expansion of the claims on the private sector, which increased by 8,3% in January-September 2004, compared to an 6,5% growth rate in 2003.
- The **Cyprus Stock Market** shows a decreasing trend during 2004 and the all-share price index fell to 72,31 units in September 2004, compared to 87,97 units in September 2003.

Composite Leading Indicator for the Overall Economic Activity

For the improvement of short-term economic analysis the Statistical Service compiles composite indicators for the Cyprus economy, by bringing together a number of individual indicators.

The most important of the indicators constructed is the composite leading indicator for the overall economic activity, which is concerned with identifying turning points of the business cycle earlier than the other customary monthly economic data - it reflects forthcoming trends in economic activity with a lead of about six months. For the compilation of the leading indicator, a number of economic series has been used which, by their nature, demonstrate predictive potential and can thus provide an indication of the performance of the Cyprus economy in the near future.

The causes, consequences, duration and magnitude of changes in an economy vary and therefore the composite indicators, which extend to a wide range of economic activities, can provide a better evaluation of the fluctuations than do individual indicators separately. Composite indicators are less affected by irregular fluctuations and therefore the inaccuracies that may exist in individual indicators are significantly reduced.

The methodology adopted for compiling the composite indicators involves the use of the X-11 Programme of the U.S. Bureau of the Census to seasonally adjust the component series, the computation of moving averages for smoothing irregular variations, the detrending of the series and, after some further adjustments, the combination of the various series to composite indicators using the arithmetic mean.

The series included in the compilation of the composite leading indicator for the overall economic activity are: the number of vacancies outstanding at the District Labour Offices; building permits authorised; registrations of motor vehicles; price index of shares; money supply; the exchange rate of the pound sterling to the Cyprus pound; the composite leading indicator for tourism; and the business climate indicators for manufacturing, tourism and services.

On the basis of the latest available data, the composite leading indicator for the overall economic activity (figure 1) showed an increasing trend for 2004. (It should be noted that the composite leading indicator from June 2004 to August 2004 is based on an incomplete set of data and is subject to revision).

It should be emphasised that the composite indicators do not measure the absolute level of output or actual rates of growth but are concerned only with identifying the cyclical variations around the long-term trend. In particular, the leading indicator provides early indications of cyclical turning points in economic activity. For example, a downturn in the leading indicator indicates that there will be a downturn in the business cycle, i.e., a reduction in the growth rate below that of its long-term trend, but it does not necessarily imply a negative growth rate.


Composite Leading Indicator for Tourism

The series included in the construction of the composite leading indicator for tourism are: the composite leading indicator for the E.U.; the consumer confidence indicator for the E.U.; the exchange rate of a number of foreign currencies relative to the Cyprus pound (inverted), weighted according to the proportion of visitors to Cyprus using these currencies; the level of consumer prices in Cyprus in relation to those in the E.U. (inverted); existing bed capacity in tourist accommodation; business position expectations in the hotel industry for the next six months; demand expectations in the hotel industry for the next three months; and price expectations in the hotel industry for the next three months.

The composite leading indicator for tourism (figure 2) showed a marginal but increasing trend from February 2004 to March 2004. From April to June the trend is reversed and the indicator fell marginally. From July to August we are again faced to a more significant increase of the indicator. These developments are shown in the diagrams on page 12

FIGURE 1: COMPOSITE LEADING INDICATOR FOR THE OVERALL ECONOMIC ACTIVITY


1995 = 100

Business and Consumer Survey Results for the E.U.

According to the latest results of the European Commission business and consumer surveys, the economic sentiment indicator for the EU-25, improved slightly by 0,6 points in October 2004 compared to September 2004. The ESI is composed of the industrial confidence indicator (40%), the service confidence indicator (30%), the consumer confidence indicator (20%), the construction confidence indicator (5%), and the retail trade confidence indicator (5%). The increase of 0,6 point is due to improvements in the retail trade confidence indicator (3 points), and the service confidence indicator (1 point). Confidence indicators in industry and construction and the consumer confidence indicator remained steady compared to September 2004.

World Economic Developments

According to the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat), (see summary table 3 on page 31) inflation in the EU-25 in September 2004 rose to 2,1% compared to September 2003. The lowest inflation rates were recorded in Finland (0,2%), Denmark (0,9%), Netherlands and United Kingdom (1,1%) and the highest rates were recorded in Latvia (7,7%), Hungary (6,7%) and Slovakia (6,4%). For Cyprus the harmonised index of consumer price rose to 1,8% compared to September 2003.

The EU-25 seasonally adjusted unemployment rate stood at 9,0% in August 2004 unchanged compared to July 2004. In August 2004, the lowest unemployment rates were recorded in Luxembourg (4,3%), Ireland (4,4%), Cyprus and Austria (both 4,5) and the highest unemployment rates were recorded in Poland (18,7%), Slovakia (15,7%), Lithuania and Spain (both 11,0%).

According to the latest “World Economic Outlook”, (see table on page 14) prepared by the IMF staff and published in September 2004, world output is projected to expand by 5,0% in 2004 and 4,3% in 2005, compared to a 3,0% growth rate in 2003.

World trade volume (goods and services) is expected to expand by 8,8% in 2004 and 7,2% in 2005, compared to a 5,1% increase in 2003.

The average price of oil in U.S. dollars was \$28.89 in 2003; the assumed price for 2004 and 2005 is \$37.25.

According to the Autumn 2004 economic forecasts published by the services of the European Commission (based on available data up to 18 of October, 2004) GDP in the EU-25 is estimated to expand by 2,5 in 2004 approaching 2,4% in 2006 compared to a 1,0% growth in 2003.

The unemployment rate is expected to remain stable at 9,1% this year and the next before slowdown at 8,8% in 2006.

Inflation is expected to fall from 2,2% in 2004 at 1,9% in 2006

The main features of the Autumn 2004 forecasts for the principal macro-economic aggregates of the EU-25, as prepared by the Directorate-General II for Economic and Financial Affairs of the European Commission, are summarized in the table below.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATORY NOTES

AGRICULTURE

Volume Indices of Agricultural Production: The indices cover livestock production and are based on data on the slaughterings of animals and sales of cows milk. As all other indices in this report, the index is base weighted of the Laspeyres type; the weights of the various products are proportional to their total value at producer prices in 1995.

INDUSTRIAL

Turnover Index of Industrial Sector: It is compiled from the monthly turnover of a representative sample of enterprises. The weights given to the various industries are proportional to their turnover in 2000, derived from the Census of Industrial Production.

Volume Index of Industrial Production: This is a composite index of the volume indices of mining and quarrying, manufacturing, electricity, gas and water.

MINING AND QUARRYING

Volume Index of Mining and Quarrying Production: The index is compiled from data on the production of minerals and quarrying materials obtained from the Mines Department and mining enterprises, supplemented with data from other sources. The weights utilised are proportional to the value of the various products at producer prices in 2000.

MANUFACTURING

Volume Index of Manufacturing Production: It is compiled from data on the quantities of the main products manufactured by a representative sample of enterprises; in the case of heterogeneous products where no quantity measurement is possible, value indices are compiled, deflated by corresponding price indices. The weights given to the various industries are proportional to their value added in 2000, derived from the 2000 Census of Industrial Production.

ELECTRICITY, GAS AND WATER

Volume Indices of Production: The indices are based on data on the billed consumption of electricity (i.e., excluding the amount of electricity supplied to the areas occupied by the Turkish invading forces), sales of gas, sales of the Water Boards and the quantity of water purified.

ENERGY

Sales of Petroleum Products are compiled from monthly returns submitted by the petroleum companies. They include sales to industrial establishments, petrol stations, ships, aircraft, military forces, and others. Data for heavy fuel

oil include also direct imports by the Electricity Authority and the cement industries. The cement industries also use coal partly in substitution of fuel oil.

Electricity: Data on the production of electricity pertain to the Electricity Authority of Cyprus only. They refer to gross production i.e. the amount of electric energy produced as metered at the output terminals of all sets in the power stations. Consumption figures refer to the billed sales of the Electricity Authority.

CONSTRUCTION

Production Index: The index measures the quarterly changes in production value at constant prices. It is based on a sample of enterprises active in the construction sector. For the calculation of the index and for every quarter the information collected is either work done, or turnover or hours worked by the production personnel (according to the enterprise) and this output measures are then deflated by the Output Prices index.

Price Index of Construction Materials: The price index is based on an extensive list of the main construction materials. The index measures price changes which are compiled monthly from the main distributors or producers of construction materials. The weights of the various materials are proportional to their respective values at market prices in the base year 2000.

Labour Cost Index: The index measures variations in the average hourly labour cost for manual workers in the construction sector. Labour cost comprises the basic wage-rate, the cost of living allowance, and the employers' contributions to the Social Insurance, Medical, Provident, Holiday, Annual Leave with Pay, 56th Week, Redundancy and Industrial Training Funds. The index is compiled from data for the main occupations taken from the paylists of a representative sample of building contractors. The weights utilised for the compilation of the overall index are based on the wage-bill for the various occupations in April 2000.

Output Prices Index: The quarterly index measures the movements in prices charged to clients of construction work. It is based on a sample of enterprises and a list of various construction tasks for which unit prices are requested. It is used also as a deflator for the calculation of the Production index.

TRANSPORT, STORAGE AND COMMUNICATION

Turnover Value Index for Transport, Storage and Communication: The Index covers Land, Water and Air Transport activities, Supporting and Auxiliary activities, Telecommunication and Postal Services. It is compiled from data obtained in a monthly sample survey, relating to the monthly turnover of the above activities. The weights allocated to the various activities are proportional to their turnover in 2000.

New Registrations of Motor-Vehicles: The data refer to both new and second-hand vehicles. License "A" is for heavy or light goods vehicles carrying loads for reward and Licence "B" refers to vehicles carrying loads for the owner's account.

DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE

Turnover Value and Volume Indices: Turnover Value Indices are compiled from data collected in a monthly survey covering a sample of enterprises. The Indices are published for a selected number of activities according to the STS-Regulations. The weighting figure is the turnover of the activity measured by the Distributive Trade Survey of 2000.

Turnover Volume Indices of Retail Trade are calculated by deflating Turnover Value Indices of Retail Trade by a selected number of components from the HICP.

SERVICES

Turnover Value Index: The index measures the monthly changes in turnover. It is based on a sample of enterprises active in the services sector. The turnover is collected from the enterprises monthly and the results are presented quarterly. The weights of the various enterprises are proportional to their output in 2000.

FOREIGN TRADE

Source of Data: Foreign trade statistics are compiled from the declarations made by importers and exporters on the completed customs documents which are received by the Statistical service after they have been cleared by Customs. Transit trade is excluded. Exports are in FOB values and imports in CIF values.

Total Imports comprise all merchandise imported whether or not they are intended for use in Cyprus, or for re-export; they include goods cleared directly by Customs at the time of importation and goods imported and placed into bonded warehouses.

Imports for Home Consumption include goods cleared by Customs at the time of importation and goods withdrawn from bonded warehouses, for home consumption.

Total Exports include domestic exports and re-exports.

Domestic Exports are goods which have been produced, manufactured or partly manufactured in Cyprus.

Re-exports are goods originally imported and re-exported in the same condition in which they were imported, or after undergoing repair or minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

MONETARY STATISTICS

All Banks: These include: the Bank of Cyprus, Public Company, the Arab Bank PLC, the National Bank of Greece (Cyprus), the National Bank of Greece S.A., the Cyprus Popular Bank, the Hellenic Bank, the Alpha Bank, the Co-operative Central Bank, the Universal Bank, the Mortgage Bank of Cyprus, the Cyprus Development Bank, the Housing Finance Corporation, the Societe Generale Cyprus and the Emporiki Bank-Cyprus.

Total Liquidity consists of currency outside all banks and demand, savings and time deposits held by the domestic private sector, public corporations and municipalities, with all banks.

Money Supply (or primary liquidity) comprises currency held by the public and demand deposits.

Quasi-Money (or secondary liquidity) consists of savings, time deposits and residents' foreign currency.

Monetary Statistics relating to Co-operative Financial Institutions are published, in addition to the statistics compiled by the Central Bank, in order to give a more complete picture of short-term developments in the monetary sector. The data are compiled by the Department of Co-operative Development.

PRICES

Consumer Price Index: The index measures changes in the retail prices of goods and services consumed by private households. It is based on the price movements of a representative selection of goods and services. The prices of the various items are collected once a month, on a Thursday nearest to the middle of each month; fruit and vegetables are collected on a weekly basis (every Thursday), and rents on a monthly basis. The base year is 1998 and the weights are based on the results of the Household Consumption Expenditure survey.

Price Index of Industrial Production: The index aims to measure the variations in the average ex-factory prices of the main manufactured products sold in the home market and exported. It is compiled from data on the prices prevailing as on the first Thursday of each month (excluding discounts, commissions and excise duties), obtained from a representative sample of

manufacturers. The weights of the various industries are proportional to their output in 2000.

Commercial Rent Index

The index is compiled from data collected in a sample survey covering most sectors of economic activity except agriculture, mining and quarrying, electricity, gas and water, where premises are mainly owner-occupied. The general rent index is the weighted average of the sectoral indices. The weights are proportional to the total amount of rents paid in the various sectors in the base year 1990 derived from the various sectoral surveys.

LABOUR

Employment data are based on the results of a quarterly survey covering all establishments employing 30 or more persons and a rotating probability sample of establishments employing up to 29 persons. They refer to the average number of persons employed during the month, and part-time employees are converted into full-time equivalent on the basis of the number of hours worked. The data include working proprietors and working partners, unpaid family workers, and persons temporarily absent from work, eg. on sick leave, casual leave or vacation.

Registered Unemployment comprises all persons who are registered as unemployed at the District Labour Offices on the last day of each month, and are currently available for work. It includes persons receiving unemployment benefit under the Social Insurance Scheme as well as those not entitled to any benefit.

TOURISM

Travellers: Are all persons who pass through passport control at the ports and airports of Cyprus. The various categories of travellers are visitors, residents, and emigrants or immigrants.

Source of data: From 14.6.1991-May 1997, the statements prepared by airline and shipping companies were the main source of data for tourism and migration statistics. These statements provided information only on the total number of passengers on each flight/route. Thus from the second half of 1991-May 1997 data for most categories of travellers are based on estimations. As from June 1997 the figures for the various categories of travellers are based on the results of the Passenger Survey carried out at airports / ports by the Statistical Service.

NOTES ON THE TABLES

Seasonally Adjusted and Moving Average Series

Certain series are presented in seasonally adjusted form and as a moving average of deseasonalised figures. The seasonal adjustment factors have been derived from running the data through the Seasonal Adjustment Program of the U.S. Bureau of the Census. The reader can obtain the seasonal adjustment indices for any month by dividing the actual data by the seasonally adjusted

figures, which in the tables are designated by the shorthand expression sa. In view of the smallness and openness of the Cyprus economy, irregular or erratic disturbances can have a significant impact on the behaviour of certain time series. Thus, in series where irregular factors are estimated to be important, an appropriate moving average of seasonally adjusted monthly data is also presented. The moving average is referred to by the shorthand expression ma with the span of months it covers in brackets.

Rounding may lead to slight discrepancies between the sum of individual items and the totals in some tables.




