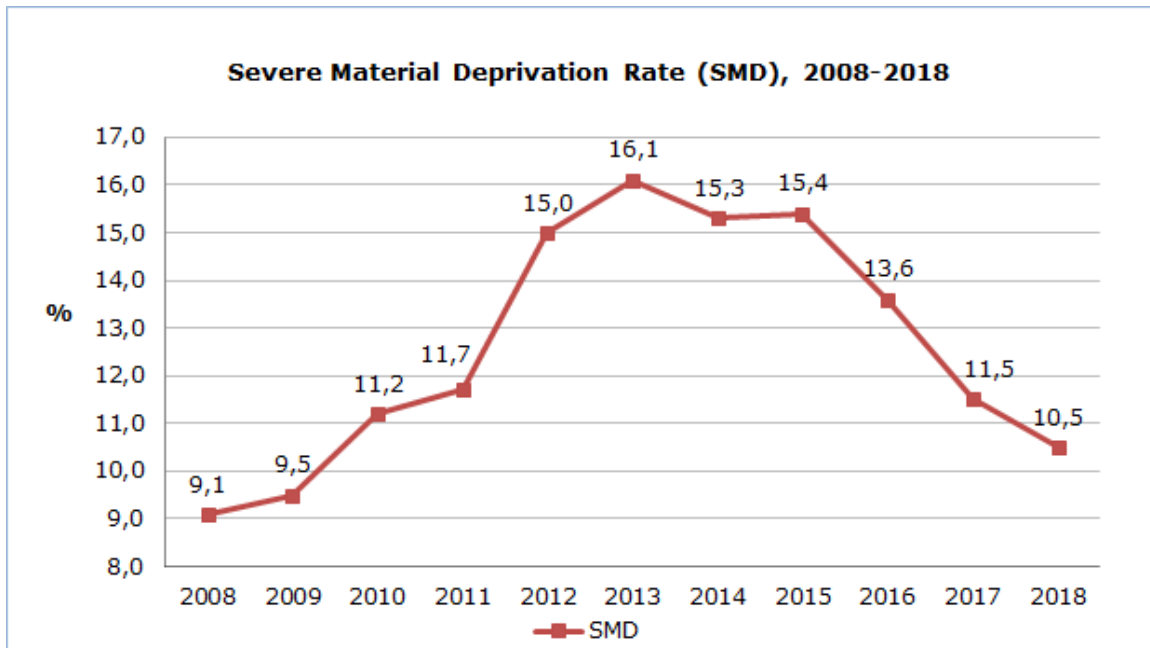


Severe Material Deprivation Indicator (SMD)

According to the results of the survey on Income and Living Conditions of the Households (SILC), 2018, the provisional percentage of the population that were severely materially deprived decreased to 10,5% in comparison to 11,5% and 13,6% that was in 2017 and 2016 respectively.



In 2018, the indicator seems to return to the levels that were prevalent before 2010, preserving its downward trend of the recent years after 2013, where it had reached its peak with a percentage of 16,1%.

Severe Material Deprivation (definition)

Severely materially deprived is the population living in conditions severely constrained by a lack of resources. They experience at least 4 out of 9 of the following deprivation items (goods or services), they cannot afford:

- To pay on time their rent or utility bills or loans
- A week's holiday away from home
- To face unexpected expenses
- To keep their home adequately warm
- To eat meat, fish or a protein equivalent every second day
- A car
- A telephone
- A colour TV
- A washing machine
