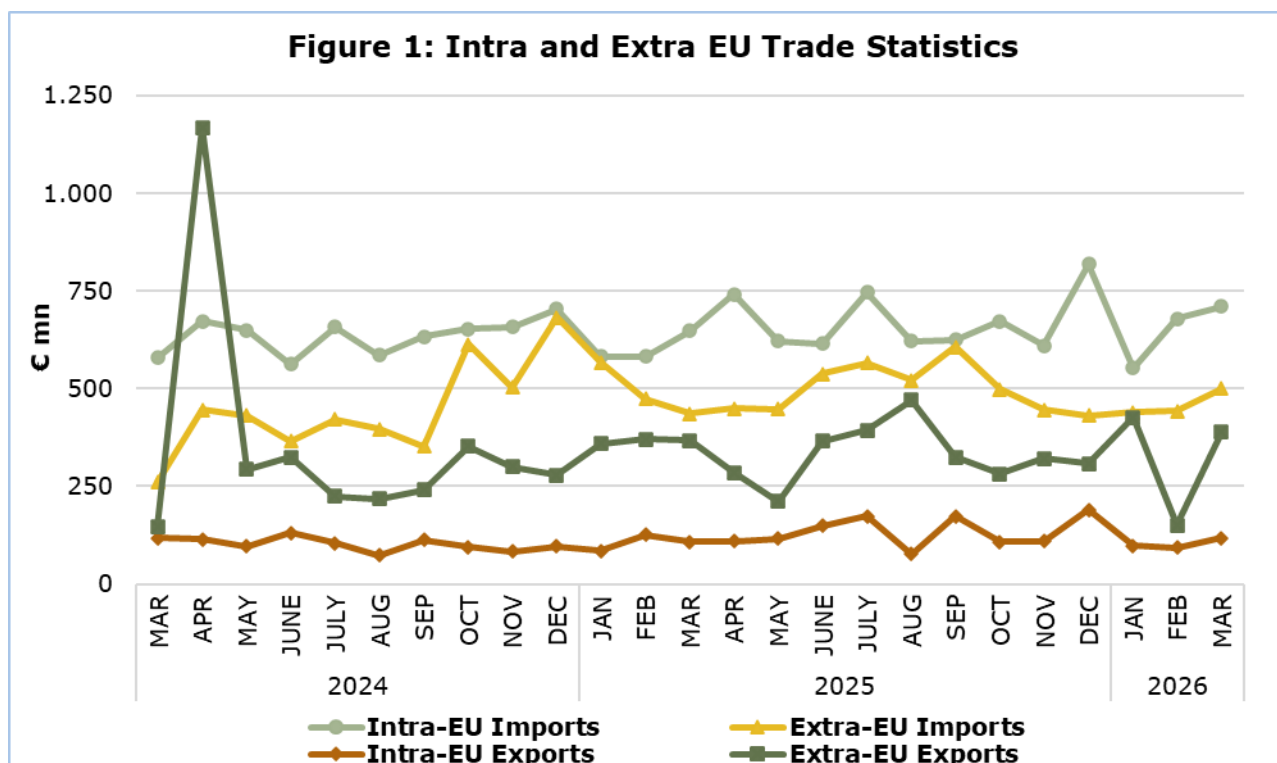
FOREIGN TRADE STATISTICS: FEBRUARY 2026 (FINAL DATA) AND MARCH 2026 (PROVISIONAL DATA)

March 2026, Provisional Data

Total imports of goods in March 2026 were €1.210,7 mn as compared to €1.084,8 mn in March 2025, recording an increase of 11,6% (Table). Imports from other EU Member States were €710,0 mn and from third countries €500,7 mn, compared to €647,9 mn and €436,9 mn respectively in March 2025 (Figure 1). Imports in March 2026 include the transfer of economic ownership of vessels and aircraft, with total value of €20,3 mn as compared to €84,2 mn in March 2025.

Total exports of goods in March 2026 were €506,9 mn as compared to €475,0 mn in March 2025, recording an increase of 6,7% (Table). Exports to other EU Member States were €117,7 mn and to third countries €389,2 mn, compared to €108,6 mn and €366,4 mn respectively in March 2025 (Figure 1). Exports in March 2026 include the transfer of economic ownership of vessels, with total value of €41,2 mn as compared to €98,1 mn in March 2025.

Total imports of goods in January–March 2026 amounted to €3.323,8 mn as compared to €3.292,3 mn in January–March 2025, recording an increase of 1,0%. **Total exports of goods in January–March 2026 were €1.276,6 mn** compared to €1.415,0 mn in January–March 2025, registering a decrease of 9,8%. **The trade deficit was €2.047,2 mn in January–March 2026** compared to €1.877,3 mn in the corresponding period of 2025.



February 2026, Final Data

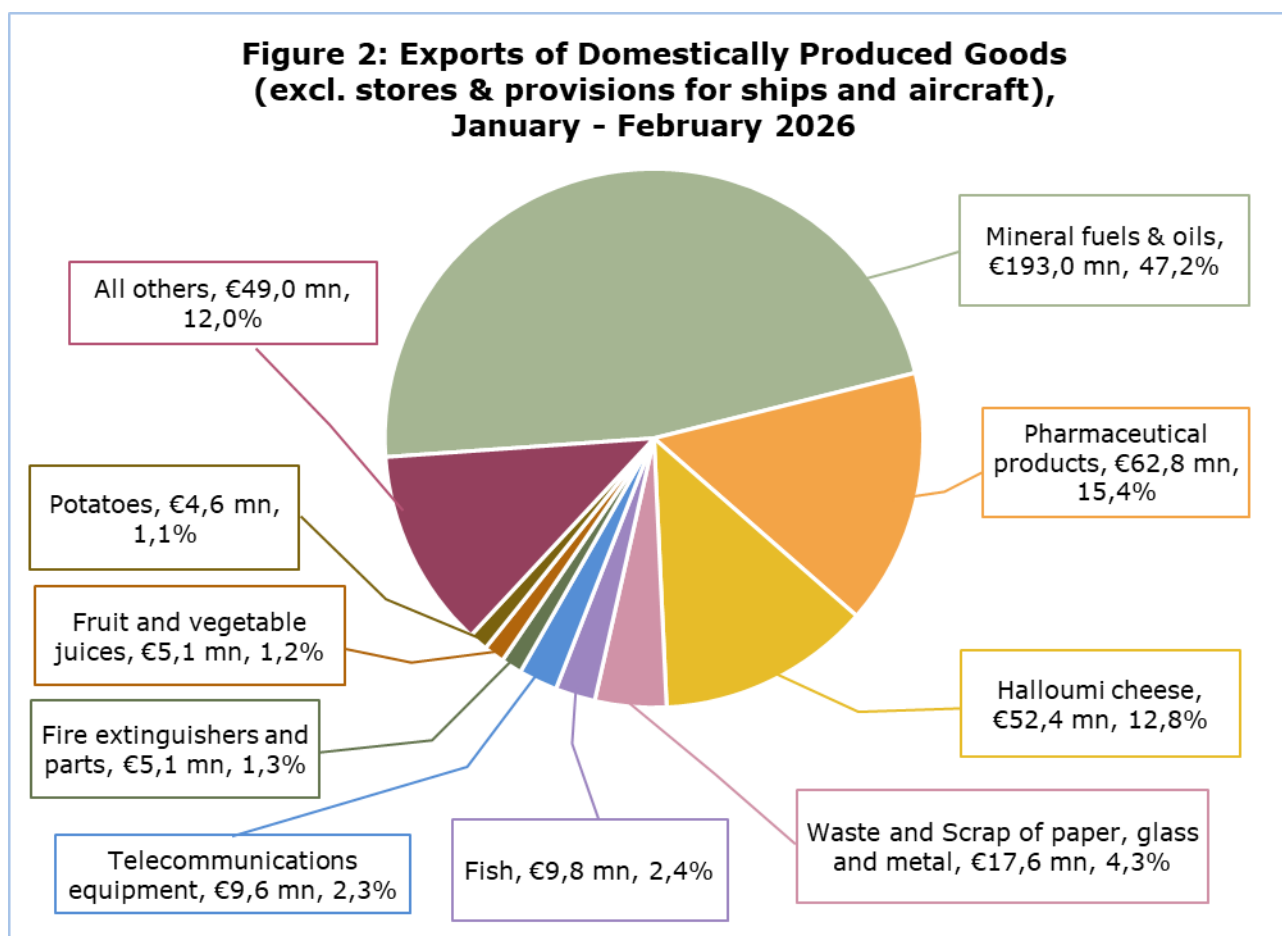
Total imports of goods amounted to €1.120,5 mn in February 2026 as compared to €1.056,4 mn in February 2025, recording an increase of 6,1%. (Table)

Exports of domestically produced products, including stores and provisions for ships and aircraft, were €153,3 mn in February 2026 as compared to €322,2 mn in February 2025, recording a decrease of 52,4%.

Domestic exports of industrial products, excluding stores and provisions for ships and aircraft, were €143,2 mn in February 2026 compared to €311,7 mn in February 2025. **Domestic exports of agricultural products, excluding stores and provisions for ships and aircraft,** were €9,3 mn in February 2026 compared to €9,5 mn in February 2025.

Exports of foreign products, including stores and provisions for ships and aircraft, were €91,1 mn in February 2026 as compared to €174,0 mn in February 2025, recording a decrease of 47,6%.

Main categories of exports of domestically produced goods for the period January - February 2026 (excl. stores and provisions for ships and aircraft), were mineral fuels and oils with value €193,0 mn, pharmaceutical products with €62,8 mn and halloumi cheese with €52,4 mn. (Figure 2)

METHODOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Statistical Value

The statistical value is the value of the goods at the time and place they cross the border of Cyprus.

Domestic and Foreign Goods

Domestically produced goods are goods wholly obtained in Cyprus or goods produced in another country but their last economically substantial processing or processing that led to the manufacture of a new product or representing an important stage of manufacture, took place in Cyprus. Goods that were originally imported and have undergone repair or other minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged are not defined as domestic.

Foreign goods are goods which were not produced in the economic territory of Cyprus and compensating goods obtained under the outward processing procedure when such processing confers foreign origin.

Partner Country

Intra-EU exports and **extra-EU exports** are classified by the Member State of the EU and country of final destination of the goods, respectively. The last country to which the goods are known to be specifically directed on their outward movement from the reporting country is regarded as their final destination.

For **extra-EU imports**, the trading partner is the country of origin. In general, goods obtained entirely from a given country originate in that country. A product in the production of which two or more countries are involved, is considered as originating in the country in which the last substantial, economically justified transformation or processing took place, resulting in the manufacture of a new product or representing an important stage of manufacture.

For **intra-EU imports**, the trading partner is the Member State of consignment of the goods.

The United Kingdom is considered as an extra-EU partner country for the EU. Imports from the United Kingdom are recorded by country of consignment until 31 December 2020. As of January 2021 onwards, for trade with Northern Ireland imports are recorded by country of consignment while for trade with the United Kingdom (excluding Northern Ireland) imports are recorded by country of origin. For these reasons data on trade with the United Kingdom are not fully comparable with data on trade with other extra-EU trade partners for reference periods before and after the end of 2020.
