They help uncover inequalities, monitor progress towards gender equality, and support the development of policies that respond to the needs of all individuals.


This report presents a selection of gender statistics covering a wide range of thematic areas, including demographics, the labour market, earnings, education, research and development, public life, health, poverty and social exclusion, and criminality. Presenting gender disaggregated data, enables a deeper analysis of gender gaps and highlights areas where differences persist or progress has been made.

Reliable and comparable gender statistics are essential for evidence-based policymaking, for assessing the impact of policies and initiatives, and for ensuring accountability in national and international commitments – including the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the EU's gender equality strategies.

Through this report, the Statistical Service of Cyprus aims to support researchers, decision-makers, civil society, and the wider public with accessible, timely, and meaningful data on gender issues in Cyprus.

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
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



















5.1 Representation of women in the Council of Ministers⁽¹⁾





5.2 Percentage of Senior level civil servants by sex (salary scales A14-A16, judges are excluded)







Persons are only counted once even if they are present in several sub-indicators.

The At-risk-of-poverty or social exclusion indicator is the main indicator to monitor the EU 2030 target on poverty and social exclusion. The relevant target refers to the reduction of the number of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion by at least 15 million by 2030, and out of them, at least 5 million should be children.









Severe material and social deprivation (SMSD):

Severely materially and socially deprived is the population who cannot afford a certain good, service or social activity. It refers to the population experiencing enforced lack of at least 7 out of 13 deprivation items (6 related to the individual and 7 related to the household):

At household level:

Cannot afford:

- 1) to face unexpected expenses,
- 2) a week holiday away from home,
- 3) to pay rent or utility bills or loans on time (to be confronted with payment arrears),
- 4) a meal with meat, chicken, fish or vegetarian equivalent every second day,
- 5) to keep home adequately warm,
- 6) to have a car/van for personal use,
- 7) to replace worn-out furniture.

At individual level:

Cannot afford:

- 1) to have an internet connection,
- 2) to replace worn-out clothes by some new ones,
- 3) to have 2 pairs of properly fitting shoes (including a pair of all-weather shoes),
- 4) to spend a small amount of money each week on him/herself,
- 5) to have regular leisure activities,
- 6) to get together with friends/family for a drink/meal at least once a month.

The 6 items at individual level are only collected for people aged 16 or over. For the children below 16 it is estimated by applying the rule: if at least half the number of adults in the household lack an item, then the children living in that household are considered deprived from that item as well.
