PREFACE

This report is issued on a monthly basis and aims at providing a general view of the external trade of Cyprus and its partner countries for July 2005. It is divided into three parts. Part A pertains to total trade statistics under the general trade system, Part B to Extra-EU trade statistics under the special trade system and Part C to Intra-EU trade statistics.

The statistics of trade with non-EU countries (Extra-EU trade) are compiled mainly from THESEAS system, the computerised system of Customs Authorities for imports and the Single Administrative Document for exports. The statistics of trade with EU countries (Intra-EU trade) are compiled via the INTRASTAT system and the data collected via the VAT returns.

The valuable cooperation of the Department of Customs and Excise and the VAT Service is acknowledged.

This report was prepared by the staff of the Foreign Trade Section, under the guidance of Ms Evi Kalogirou, Statistics Officer and the general supervision of Mr. George Zeitountsian, Senior Statistics Officer, Head of the National Accounts and Foreign Trade Sections.

INTRODUCTION

DEVELOPMENTS IN EXTERNAL TRADE FOR JULY 2005

Total imports/arrivals (covering total imports from third countries and arrivals from E.U countries) in July 2005 amounted to £237,1 mn as compared to £221,2 mn in July 2004. **Total exports/dispatches** (covering total exports to third countries and dispatches to other Member States) in July 2005 were £55,5 mn compared to £45,5 mn in July 2004. As a result of the above developments the trade deficit increased to £181,7 mn in July 2005 compared to £175,7 mn in the corresponding month of 2004.

Total imports/arrivals

Imported goods were £237,1 mn in July 2005 and £221,2 mn in July 2004.

a. Total imports/arrivals by H.S Section

Section XVI of Harmonized System 'Machinery and mechanical appliances' being the main source of supply in July 2005, accounted for £44,0 mn, followed by Section V 'Mineral products' with £37,9 mn and Section XVII 'Vehicles, aircraft, vessels and associated transport with £27,5 mn.

b. Total imports/arrivals by economic destination

- Intermediate inputs destined for the local market head the list with £68,2 mn or 28,8% as against £67,3 mn or 30,5% in July 2004. The manufacturing sector absorbed £37,1 mn as compared with £37,2 mn in July 2004. Raw materials for the construction sector were £16,8 mn in July 2005 and £16,0 mn in July 2004.
- Consumer goods valued at £64,4 mn or 27,2% in July 2005 and £59,3 mn or 26,8% in July 2004.
- Fuels and lubricants, including crude petroleum oil, valued at £37,4 mn in July 2005 and £26,0 mn in the corresponding month of 2004.
- Transport equipment with their parts accounted for £30,4 mn as compared with £42,8 mn in July 2004.
- Capital goods valued at £32,8 mn in July 2005 and £24,6 mn in July 2004. The transport, storage and communication sector, occupying the first place in importance, absorbed £15,2 mn as against £5,6 mn in July 2004. The manufacturing sector was £5,6 mn in July 2005 as against £6,3 mn in July 2004. Capital goods destined for the construction and mining sectors valued at £1,7 mn in July 2005 and at £1,8 mn in July 2004. Capital goods for agriculture accounted for £0,7 mn in July 2005 and £0,6 mn in the corresponding month of 2004.

c. Total imports/arrivals by area

- The European Union continued to be the main source of supply of goods to Cyprus, with a share of £154,6 mn in July 2005. Major suppliers within the Union were Greece

with £46,5 mn, Italy £23,2 mn, the United Kingdom £18,8 mn and Germany £17,5 mn.

- Imports from all other European countries totaled £5,8 mn in July 2005.
- Imports from the rest of the world in July 2005 amounted to £76,7 mn with Israel contributing £19,8 mn, China (People's Republic of) £10,6 mn and Japan £9,2 mn.

Total exports/dispatches

Total exports/dispatches including stores and provisions, accounted for £55,5 mn as compared with £45,5 mn in July 2004. Total exports/dispatches of domestically produced goods, including stores and provisions, were £20,9 mn in July 2005 whilst total exports/dispatches of foreign goods, including stores and provisions, were £34,6 mn.

a. Total exports/dispatches, including stores and provisions, by H.S Section

Section XVI 'Machinery, electrical equipment and parts' of Harmonized System head the list with £16,6 mn followed by Section V 'Mineral products' with £12,0 mn, Section XVII 'Vehicles, aircraft, vessels and associated transport equipment' with £6,9 mn and Section VI 'Products of the chemical or allied industries' with £6,0 mn.

b. Total exports/dispatches of domestically produced goods, excluding stores and provisions, by category

- Industrial products of domestic produce exported during July 2005 accounted for £17,9 mn whereas industrial products of domestic produce exported during July 2004 were £18,0 mn. Major export earners were pharmaceutical products £4,2 mn and cheese (including halloumi cheese) £1,8 mn.
- Exports/dispatches of raw agricultural products were £1,1 mn in July 2005 and £1,9 mn in July 2004.
- Mineral exports were £0,2 mn in July 2005 and £0,4 mn in July 2004.

c. Total exports/dispatches by area

- Dispatches to the European Union accounted for £28,3 mn in July 2005 constituting thus 51% of the total exports/dispatches. Dispatches to the United Kingdom accounted for £7,7 mn, to Greece for £6,2 mn, to France for £6,2 mn and to Germany for £5,2 mn.
- Exports to Near and Middle Eastern countries in July 2005 occupied the second place in importance with £5,5 mn.
- Exports to all other European countries amounted to £2,5 mn.
- Exports to the rest of the world were £7,5 mn.
- Stores and provisions in July 2005 valued at £11,7 mn.

APPENDIX

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED

Arrivals

"Arrivals" are analogous to imports.

Arrivals include:

- a) goods in free circulation which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus;
- b) goods which have been placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (for processing, transformation or repair) in another Member State and which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus.
- c) Some goods movements are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular, aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in another Member State to a person established in the Cyprus are included in the statistics of arrivals of Cyprus.

Dispatches

"Dispatches" are analogous to exports.

Dispatches include:

- a) goods in free circulation which leave the statistical territory of Cyprus bound for another Member State;
- b) goods which have been placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (for processing, transformation or repair) in Cyprus and which are destined for another Member State.
- c) Some goods movements are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular, aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in the Cyprus to a person established in another Member State are included in the statistics on dispatches of Cyprus.

Imports

Imports **under special trade system** include:

- a) Goods, which enter the statistical territory of Cyprus from a non-member country and are:

- Placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for release into free circulation (goods intended to be consumed in Cyprus or dispatched to another Member State), either immediately or after a period in a CUSTOMS warehouse or
- Placed under the CUSTOMS procedure for inward processing or processing under CUSTOMS control (usually goods destined to be processed, transformed or repaired for subsequent re-export) either immediately or after a period in a CUSTOMS warehouse.

- b) Some movements of goods are included in statistics based on specific conditions. In particular aircraft and ships whose ownership has been transferred from a person established in a non-member country to a person established in Cyprus are included in import statistics of Cyprus.

Exports

Exports **under special trade system** include:

- a) goods that leave the statistical territory of Cyprus bound for a non-member country, having gone through:

- The CUSTOMS export procedure (final export, export following inward processing, etc.); or
- The CUSTOMS outward-processing procedure (usually goods destined to be processed, transformed or repaired for subsequent re-import).

According to the H.S. Convention, the HS "means the Nomenclature comprising the headings and the subheadings and their related numerical codes, the Section, Chapter and Subheadings notes and the General Rules for the interpretation of the Harmonised System". The H.S. is designed as a "multipurpose nomenclature", to be used for transportable goods. Both H.S. and C.N. are therefore concerned heavily with the nature or material of the product.

The shape of the H.S. and the C.N. classifications is illustrated in the following table:

Country classification

The classification of countries is the country nomenclature (Geonomenclature) as set annually in the Official Journal of the European Communities. The full list of countries is given in an essentially geographical order in Table 4, Part A, Total trade statistics.

For imports (extra-EU trade), the trading partner is the country of origin. In general, goods obtained entirely from a given country originate in that country. A product, in the production of which two or more countries were concerned, is considered as originating in the country in which the last transformation or substantial processing took place. Packing repacking, sorting and blending are not regarded as manufacturing processes.

Trade systems

There are broadly two approaches, closely linked with customs procedures, used for the measurement of international trade in goods: the general trade system and the special trade system.

General trade system

The general trade system is the wider concept and under it the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the economic territory of Cyprus with the exception of simple transit trade. In particular all goods which are received into customs warehouses are recorded as imports at that stage whether or not they subsequently go into free circulation in Cyprus. Similarly, outgoing goods from customs warehouses are included in the general trade aggregates at the time they leave Cyprus.

Special trade system

The special trade system is a narrower concept. Goods from a foreign country which are received into customs warehouse are not recorded in the special trade aggregates unless they subsequently go into free circulation in Cyprus (or are placed under the customs procedures for inward processing). Similarly, outgoing goods from customs warehouses are not recorded as exports.

Stores and provisions

Stores and provisions denote ships' and aircraft's stores and supplies.

- ships and aircraft's stores' means the various products for consumption by the crew and passengers of vessels or aircraft;
- ships and aircraft's supplies' means the products for the operation of the engines, machines and other equipment on vessels or aircraft, such as fuel, oil and lubricants.

Domestic and foreign goods

Domestic goods are goods originating in the economic territory of Cyprus; if they have been wholly obtained in it or were substantially transformed by processing in it, so that the processing confers domestic origin. Goods originally imported and having undergone only repair or minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged are not defined as domestic. Minor operations include blending, packaging, bottling, cleaning, sorting, husking and selling.

Foreign goods are goods originating in the rest of the world, i.e. not included in the economic territory of Cyprus and compensating goods obtained under the outward processing procedure when such processing confers foreign origin.
